Graduate Research Assistant Training Program in Veterinary Clinical Pharmacology

The Clinical Pharmacology Program in the Department of Anatomy, Physiology and Pharmacology of the College of Veterinary Medicine at Auburn University is seeking a graduate research assistant to participate in a Clinical Pharmacology training program. The 4 to 5 year program can begin immediately and is designed to meet qualifications for a PhD. The potential for residency training such that the requirements can be met for certification in the American College of Veterinary Clinical Pharmacology is possible. The trainee will have research responsibilities that focus on antimicrobial resistance (http://www.vetmed.auburn.edu/index.pl/research_announcements2) and service responsibilities that support the therapeutic drug monitoring laboratory (<http://www.vetmed.auburn.edu/index.pl/clinpharmlab>). Participation with clinical house officers in rounds and journal clubs provided through the Veterinary Teaching Hospital is expected; other clinical service responsibilities (ie, primary case management) will depend on the interest and expertise of the successful candidate. The program will begin October 01, 2007.

Qualifications include the DVM or comparable degree. Preference will be given to those individuals with at least one-year experience in the practice of clinical medicine in any species and with interest in certification in specialty boards accredited by the American Veterinary Medical Association.

The successful candidate must be accepted into graduate school at Auburn University. Implementation of the successful candidate's graduate program can be expedited if electronic application to graduate school (www.grad.auburn.edu) is made at the time of credential submission. Application should be made to biomedical sciences with a concentration on pharmacology. For graduate school, official transcripts must be submitted to Rosa Jackson, Director of Graduate Admissions, 106 Hargis Hall, 36849-5122. The successful candidate also must be able to meet eligibility requirements to work in the U.S. and must be able to communicate in English.
