# Veterinary Dentistry for the DVM

This course will provide lectures and a wet lab in veterinary dentistry for veterinarians. The course will cover dental pathology and treatment options, evaluating dental radiographs with pathology, proper extraction equiptment and techniques and more. 
## CLASS REUNIONS


