AUBURN UNIVERSITY, Auburn, Alabama, USA, and UNIVERSITY OF AGRONOMIC SCIENCES AND VETERINARY MEDICINE, Bucharest, Romania, wishing to develop cooperative relations on the basis of established contacts and mutual understandings, especially to develop academic and cultural interchange through mutual assistance in the areas of education and research, agree as follows. This collaboration is led by Auburn University College of Agriculture and should serve as a broad MOU for other AU colleges who may be interested in participating in.

#### PART I Area of Cooperation

The area of cooperation includes, subject to mutual consent and appropriate conditions, the program(s) of agriculture, veterinary medicine, forestry, and environmental sciences offered at both universities, seen as desirable, feasible, and contributory to the fostering and development of the cooperative relationship between the Colleges of the two universities.

#### PART II Methods

All understandings and assistance shall be subject to availability of funds and the specific approval of the Dean of each participating college at AUBURN UNIVERSITY and of the unit leader of UNIVERSITY OF AGRONOMIC SCIENCES AND VETERINARY MEDICINE, through such activities or programs as:

- 1. Exchange of faculty members and technical staff
- 2. Exchange of students with an executed student exchange agreement
- 3. Conduct joint research activities
- 4. Participation in seminars and academic meetings
- 5. Special short-term academic programs
- 6. Cultural exchange activities
- 7. Joint participation in international training courses
- 8. Provide opportunities for staff development for both universities by participation in personnel development programs
- 9. Engage in consultancies

The institutions<sup>1</sup> named below agree to cooperate for the exchange of students and/or staff in the context of the Erasmus+ programme. This agreement is valid for the Erasmus+ call years 20[21]-20[27] in:

- KA131
- KA171

The institutions commit to sound and transparent management of funds allocated to them through Erasmus+ and to respect the quality requirements of the Programme, outlined in the <u>Erasmus Charter for Higher Education</u><sup>2</sup> and in this agreement.

The institutions agree on exchanging their mobility-related data according to the <u>principles of GDPR</u><sup>3</sup> and in line with the technical standards of the <u>European Student Card Initiative</u><sup>4</sup>, when this becomes available for international mobility involving third countries not associated to the Programme.

Sending institutions located in EU/EEA countries have to ensure compliance with the provisions of art. 46 GDPR for all participants' personal data exchanged in the context of their mobility with institutions from non-EU/EEA countries without an adequacy decision, on the condition that enforceable data subject rights and effective legal remedies for data subjects are available in the respective third country. The participants should be informed in a transparent manner about the level of protection of their personal data, if this is different from the one where the sending institution is located.

- Provide assistance related to obtaining insurance, when required, for incoming and outgoing mobile participants, according to the requirements of the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education and use project funds in the most inclusive way to cover related costs partially or in full. The receiving institution will inform mobile participants of cases in which insurance cover is not automatically provided.
- The receiving institution will inform about the existence of relevant infrastructure and provide support to incoming participants with fewer opportunities.
- Provide appropriate mentoring and support arrangements for mobile participants, including for those pursuing blended mobility, as well as integrate incoming mobile participants into the wider student community and in the Institution's everyday life.
- Provide participants with their **grant as soon as possible upon arrival**, including if necessary a first payment using cash, check or similar to avoid delays linked to opening a bank account.
- The institutions commit to encourage participants to act as ambassadors of the Erasmus+ Programme and share their mobility experience, e.g. by providing information about the existence of Erasmus+ alumni networks, inviting former participants in promotion activities, etc.

#### 6. Recognition

#### Institutions commit to:

  - o Providing incoming mobile students and their sending institutions with free-of-charge transcripts. The documents must be in English or in the language of the sending institution and containing a full, accurate and timely record of the achievements at the end of the mobility period.
  - o A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than [5] weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. [it should normally not exceed five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines]
  - o Providing students on traineeships and staff with a certificate for the activities completed. It is recommended to issue a certificate towards the end of the mobility period.

#### 7. Grading systems of the institutions

It is recommended that receiving Institutions provide the statistical distribution of grades or make the information available through <u>EGRACONS</u> according to the descriptions in the <u>ECTS users' guide</u><sup>13</sup>. The table will facilitate the interpretation of each grade awarded to students and will facilitate the credit transfer by the sending institution.

#### 8. Any other information regarding the terms of the agreement (optional)

The colleges of Auburn University participating in this agreement (College of Agriculture and College of Veterinary Medicine) shall not engage in the exchange of students for academic credit hours, nor shall they provide any tuition waivers. Auburn University colleges will only accept individuals from RO BUCURES12, including students, staff, and faculty, who are entering the United States under J-1 scholar/intern visa categories or as B1/B2 visa holders. Auburn University hosting colleges can provide certification of participation, performance evaluation, and other requested documentation from the home institution or complete any required forms provided by the home institution. The decision to issue academic credits rests with the home institution, which will determine if/how credits would be awarded within their own system. When Auburn University sends its students, faculty, or staff to RO BUCURES12, the purpose will not be to enroll in or earn academic credit from the host institution; instead, it will be for research, training, and outreach activities. Consequently, all previous terms regarding receiving grades, transcripts, credit hours, etc., from Auburn University shall not apply to this specific collaboration, although they remain part of the general agreement.

#### 9. Termination of the agreement

[It is up to the involved institutions to agree on the procedure for modifying or terminating the inter-institutional agreement. However, in the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. The termination clauses must include the following disclaimer: "Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict."]
